SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

The editorial board of the collection of scientific papers “*Typology of Language Meanings in Diachronic and Contrastive Aspects*” published by the Faculty of Foreign Languages, Vasyl' Stus Donetsk National University (Vinnytsia), welcomes manuscripts from researchers in linguistics.

“*Typology of Language Meanings in Diachronic and Contrastive Aspects*” is enlisted as a specialized linguistic periodical by the Higher Commission of Academic Degrees and Titles of Ukraine, the latest update of the accreditation – Decree of the Ministry of Education and Science № 1714 as of 28.12.2017.

The Journal is **bi-annual**.

The journal covers a wide scope of problems related to the study of languages and their translation. We accept research papers on the subjects of Indo-European linguistics and translation studies of Indo-European languages.

Subject areas of study include, but are not limited to:

- general linguistics (phonology, morphology, syntax, semantics, pragmatics);
- cognitive linguistics;
- comparative linguistics;
- diachronic linguistics;
- corpus linguistics;
- stylistics;
- (critical) discourse analysis;
- intercultural communication.

The Journal welcomes previously unpublished papers reflecting linguistic research results. Authors are not to submit manuscripts or their fragments that have been published before or have been submitted to another journal and are under consideration. All submissions must fully meet the requirements of the Journal. The Editorial Staff will **not consider the articles that:**

- do not meet the requirements;
- do not have scientific novelty and practical significance;
- do not belong to the research areas of the journal;
- are written with the use of computer-aided translation;
- are not edited (contain grammatical and stylistic errors);
- violate the ethics of scientific research, i.e. cases of plagiarism, self-plagiarism, translation from other languages, data fabrication, duplicate publication are detected.

Your manuscript must be polished to high professional standards which means it must be of quality and context that the Editorial Board think would be of interest to an international audience.

Articles can be written in **English, German, Spanish, or Ukrainian** in compliance with the Submission Rules.

All submitted manuscripts are subject to initial evaluation by the editors, and, if found suitable for further consideration, to double-blind peer review by independent experts in the corresponding area. Manuscripts reviewing is fully confidential. Reviewer's conclusion, as well as any information regarding the submitted manuscript, is not disclosed to anybody except the author. Reviewers evaluate theoretical and methodological level of the paper, its practical value and scientific significance.

All papers are checked for plagiarism.

Submission of an article by authors shall be accepted as their confirmation to allow the Editorial Board to review, edit and publish the paper under consideration if it has been accepted for publication.

An **electronic copy of the Manuscript** and the **Author's contact details** (*.doc format) in a separate file should be submitted as the e-mail attachments to the following e-mail address: **zbirnyk.typolohiya2015@gmail.com**

The publication of articles in the Journal is **free of charge**. "*Typology of language meanings in diachronic and contrastive aspects*" is an open access journal. All articles are free for users to access, to read, to download, and to print. Every issue of the Journal is available on website <https://typology.com.ua> or <http://jtmz.donnu.edu.ua>

The printed version, if needed, is ordered by the author individually and is paid additionally (the necessity to obtain a printed copy of the Journal should be stated in the text of the e-letter to the Editorial board).

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MANUSCRIPT:

The article should be no less than 4000 but no more than 6000 words excluding tables, graphs, diagrams, figures, abstracts, references, etc. The possibility of publishing materials that exceed the aforementioned limit is discussed with the editorial board individually.

The paper submitted must have the following **structure** (numbered):

Introduction (usually one paragraph, numbered 1 (**1. Introduction**)), including: *the general outline of the problem* discussed and its connection with significant scientific and practical problems; *analysis of recent studies and publications*; *methodology* of the research;

Body with the complete validation of the results obtained (use headed sections with **2.1, 2.2** etc. numbering);

Conclusions and prospects of further research in this direction.

- page format – A 4;
- margins: upper, lower and right 20 mm, left – 30 mm;
- the first line of every new paragraph is indented (10 mm);
- line spacing – 1,5;
- font – Times New Roman, size 12 pt; (in case other types of fonts are used, send them in a separate file by e-mail).

Left-aligned UDK typed at the first line (Times New Roman, size 12 pt).

Author's (or authors') initials and surname(s) typed in bold (size 12 pt) in the upper right corner precede the title of an article.

In parentheses in the next line follows the author's name, their country of origin and the name of the town (city) they live in (size 12 pt).

A centred title of the paper is typed in capitals in bold (size 12 pt) as in the pattern shown here.

The article is accompanied with two abstracts of 150-200 words in Ukrainian and in English. The abstract should contain the author's / authors' name(s), the title of the article, its methodology, summary and a brief outline of the results. The abstract should be completed with a list of keywords (at least 5 words or phrases).

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REFERENCES

• REFERENCES follow the main body of the text in the alphabetical order. The heading REFERENCES is typed plain, capitalised and centred (Times New Roman, size 12 pt).

• The authors are recommended to consider the credibility of references: training aids, textbooks et cetera are not recommended; Wikipedia is not regarded to be a credible source; conference proceedings should be minimized; sources, whose authors or publishing dates cannot be identified, should be avoided.

• Recent publications (dated during the last 10 years) in the journals indexed in Scopus and Web of Science as well as collective monographs should be included.

- DOI of the references should be indicated.
- APA style should be used (<http://www.citationmachine.net/apa/cite-a-book>).
- The text is typed without syllabification, pages are not numbered.

✓ Please distinguish between a dash (–) and a hyphen (-).

✓ Examples (lexemes or phrases) are typed in italics: *Herz, Seele*.

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✓ References to works mentioned in the text are enclosed in parentheses, e.g. (Polenz, 1978; Chomsky 1991, p. 12). When there is more than one author of a work, they all must be listed. The surname listed last is preceded by an *and*, e.g. (Lakoff and Johnson 1980, p. 45). If there are more than three authors, only the first one is listed and et al. is added, e.g. (Ivashchenko, et al. 2009, p. 87).

✓ The word *Table* and its number are typed plain above the table title in the upper right corner.

✓ Appendices (if any) are typed sized 11 pt.

✓ Special fonts, symbols and illustrations are attached in a separate file.

✓ Do not use footnotes for references.

✓ The Manuscript is sent to the editorial board in the file format **doc**.

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
